\* The Lostwithiel Community Newsletter is published on the first day of each month and has a print run of 1,400. Copies are placed in Lostwithiel library and in businesses around Lostwithiel and in the Community Centre; 125 are sent out on-line via Mailchimp. It is widely read by those seeking local news and for information on forthcoming events.

\*\* The aim was to deliver to all properties though volunteers may have missed the odd one or two as they were difficult to find.

## Engagement with Lostwithiel's younger generation.

The Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group was concerned that public consultation events were attended mainly by those in the older age groups. The Steering Group therefore decided attempt to engage with the younger generation. There are two schools that serve Lostwithiel's primary-age pupils. It was hoped that discussing the Neighbourhood Plan with pupils in these two schools and encouraging the pupils to talk to their parents would result in reaching the age groups which hitherto have been underrepresented at public events.

An interactive workshop at Lostwithiel primary school successfully helped pupils to think about the future development of Lostwithiel and the implications for them personally. The pupils were encouraged to discuss the Neighbourhood Plan with their family and friends. A few weeks later two of the Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group visited the same class to discuss with them any further thoughts as they may have had in the meantime.

A member of the Steering Group visited St Winnow School and asked the teacher of the senior class to give each of the pupils in his class a copy of the Neighbourhood Plan Newsletter number seven. The pupils were instructed to take these home and bring them back to school two days later filled in as a result of discussing the Neighbourhood Plan with their family. Two members of the plan Steering Group then visited the class and discussed with them how they would like to see Lostwithiel developing in the future.
