TRANSPORT IN LOSTWITHIEL

The Neighbourhood Plan Group are starting to look at transport in Lostwithiel. The first stage involves two things - "Information" and "Ideas"

We have some information already, for example we know from the Office of National Statistics that the 2011 Census shows 212 households (approx. 17%) in the town have no access to a car or van. We need much more. Included with this newsletter is a survey about transport issues in Lostwithiel. **Please help us by completing and returning it** so that we can build an accurate and up to date picture of the transport situation.

Next we need your ideas. We want to develop a strong plan for the future transport needs of local people. We don't have all the answers, so we want to know what you would like to see, or perhaps "not see", in the proposals that we include in the Neighbourhood Plan. This is your chance, we want ideas on

Roads, Footpaths, Cycleways, Buses, Trains, Car Parking

and any other transport related issue.


Neighbourhood Plan ~ Steering Group

In starting to produce the Lostwithiel Neighbourhood Plan the Town Council recognised that it would be better for a smaller group than the Council to get the process started. The majority of work so far has been done by the Councillors who make up the Council's working party.

With the Plan underway we now want to expand this group so that it includes other organisations and individuals from around the town. While the Town Council has to remain legally responsible for the plan much of the work is being delegated to this new "Steering Group". The Council has now agreed the "Terms of Reference" which set out the rules for how this group will work. These are available for anyone who would like to see them. Public Exhibitions


Lostwithiel Town Council have held the first two of a series of public presentations of the ideas being considered for the Neighbourhood Plan. Over 100 people visited the display in the Community Centre in December last year and a similar number had chance to see the suggestions for housing at the Mayor's "Tea Party" the following week. In March 115 people attended the follow up meeting. A series of similar events are planned during 2016 so that local people can get involved in the discussions about local planning policies.
